AMAZING AUSSIE ANIMALS (Foundation - 6)

Struts, slithers and scales: Meet a python and some lizards. Learn about their needs, features through a sensory experience. Older levels learn about their features, adaptation, conservation status and lifecycles.

Mammal mingle: Meet a range of mammals including dingoes, Tasmanian devils, wombats and koalas. Younger levels focus on broader needs and features, while older levels explore the concept of adaptation to the environment and threats.

Feathers taking flight: Younger levels learn about a range of different birds, their needs and their different environments. Older levels learn about threats to bird species, captive breeding programs and what you can do to help species in the wild.

It's a Frog's Life: Learn about the local frogs of the area, exploring needs and features, concepts of sieve-skin, respiration, habitat and food. Older levels focus on reproduction, environmental threats, and identification.

BUSH DETECTIVES (Foundation - 6)

Minibeasts underwater: Learn about aquatic invertebrates through ponding for minibeasts. What can they tell us about their habitat and the state of the environment?

Insect Investigators: Explore different habitats around the sanctuary and discover differences between the habitats that minibeasts inhabit. Learn the difference between insects, arachnids and crustaceans.

Bush food explorers: Younger levels touch and smell a range of plants and learn how aboriginals used them and other tools from nature. Older levels learn to identify different features of plants for classification, and their links with indigenous culture.

RARER AND RARER (Levels 4 - 6)

What makes an endangered species? Why do animals become endangered? Using the endangered species found at Moonlit Sanctuary we examine how human actions such as altering habitats and introducing feral animals have caused species to become extinct and endangered.

COST

90 minute session cost per student including admission \$12.60 + gst*

60 minute session cost per student including admission \$10.50 + gst*

Extend your session by 60 minutes \$8.40 + gst* or by **45 minutes** \$6.30 + gst*

Admission only \$6.80 + gst*

Groups can stay at Moonlit Sanctuary for as long as they wish.

Minimum booking is for 60 minutes' worth of sessions.

Sessions can be 30 or 45 minutes long, therefore a minimum of 2 sessions should be selected.

You may book as many sessions as you can fit into a day.

ADULT TO STUDENT RATIO

Carers (of physically or intellectually disabled persons): 1 per person

Early childhood: 1 for every 3 paying students

Foundation to grade 2: 1 for every 5 paying students

All others: 1 for every 10 paying students

Extra adults \$12.10 + gst* (each)

* We must charge GST on every invoice, however the GST is fully rebateable to your school from the tax department.

NOTE: all programs have a minimum charge of \$200 + gst*
